## Chapter 15

## MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

Part 1<br>GENERAL REGULATIONS

§ 15-101. Definitions and Interpretations. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, except for Sections or parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq., except that in this Chapter the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway," and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.
2. The term "legal holidays" as used in this Chapter shall mean and include: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
3. In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.
§ 15-102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances, as parts of ordinances, as amendments to ordinances or as amendments to this Chapter, except where the law specifically authorizes less formal action.
§ 15-103. Provisions to Be Continuation of Existing Regulations. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
The provisions of this Chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Chapter, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations, and not as new enactments. Nothing in this Chapter shall affect any act done or liability incurred, or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any of those repealed or superseded ordinances or regulations.
§ 15-104. Temporary and Emergency Regulations. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. The Chief of Police and Emergency Management Coordinator shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.
B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
2. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police Department in
the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of not more than $\$ 25$ together with costs of prosecution.
§ 15-105. Experimental Regulations. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
The Board of Supervisors may, from time to time by resolution, designate places upon and along the highways in the where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective as if they had been specified in this Chapter. No person shall operate and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this Section. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of not more than $\$ 25$ together with costs of prosecution; provided, the purpose of this Section is to allow for test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Township relative to traffic and parking.
§ 15-106. Traffic on Streets Closed or Restricted for Construction, Maintenance or Special Events. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
3. The Board of Supervisors shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.
4. The Board of Supervisors shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.
5. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 25$ and costs.
§ 15-107. Use of Streets by Processions and Assemblages. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
6. For the purpose of this Section, the words "assemblage" and "procession" shall have the following meanings:

ASSEMBLAGE - A gathering of people without vehicles, which interferes with the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on any street.

PROCESSION - A group of individuals, vehicles, animals and/or objects moving along a street in a way that interferes with the normal movement of traffic. A procession shall not include a funeral caravan or military convoy.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless the person organizing or conducting the assemblage first obtains a permit from the Chief of Police and Township Engineer, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least one week in advance of the day on which the assemblage is proposed to be held, but in any case where a State-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least three weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall state the place where and the date when the assemblage is to be held, the hour when the assemblage may convene and the hour by which it shall have been completely dispersed. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any assemblage unless the permit has been granted, or at any time or place other than that authorized by the permit.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any procession unless the person organizing or conducting the procession first obtains a permit from the Chief of Police and Township Engineer, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least two weeks in advance of the day when the procession is proposed to be held, but in any case where the State-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least three weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall specify the date on which the procession is to be held, the route to be followed by the procession, the hour when and place where participants may commence to assemble and form before the procession is under way, the time when the procession may commence to move along its route, and the time by which the end of the procession shall have been disbanded. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any procession unless the permit shall have been granted, or under any conditions as to time or route or otherwise than those stated in the permit.
4. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 25$ and costs.
§ 15-108. Authority of Police Officers. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
The police officers of the Township are hereby authorized to direct traffic on the highways of the Township and at intersections thereof and to otherwise enforce the provisions of this Chapter.
§ 15-109. Authorization for Use of Speed Timing Devices. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. The Township Police Department is hereby authorized to use all speed timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 3368.
2. This Section authorizes the use of said devices upon all highways within the Township be they Township, County or State highways, and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to "local authorities" under the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 6101 et seq., as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified
or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.
Part 2
TRAFFIC REGULATIONS
§ 15-201. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Streets. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005; as amended by Ord. No. 2012-2, 5/7/2012]
3. Maximum speed limits are established on portions of specified streets, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any part of a street where a maximum speed limit applies at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the street:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 35$ and costs. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of $\$ 2$ per mile for each mile in excess of five miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.
§ 15-202. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Bridges and Elevated Structures. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
3. Maximum speed limits are established, as follows, on certain bridges and elevated structures, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any such bridge or elevated structure at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that bridge or elevated structure:

## Bridge or Elevated Structure Location Maximum Speed Limit (Reserved)

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 35$ and costs. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of $\$ 2$ per mile for each mile in excess of five miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.
§ 15-203. Maximum Speed Limits Established for Certain Vehicles on Hazardous Grades. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
3. The following are declared to be hazardous grades and, upon any such hazardous grade, no person shall drive a vehicle having a gross weight in excess of that referred to for that grade, in the direction stated for that grade, at a speed in excess of that established in this

Section for that grade and, if so stated for a particular grade, the driver of every such vehicle shall stop the vehicle before proceeding downhill:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 35$ and costs. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of $\$ 2$ for each mile in excess of five miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.
§ 15-204. Maximum Speed Limits Established in Parks. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
3. A speed limit of 15 miles per hour is established on all streets and roadways in the public parks maintained and operated by the Township, except in the following locations, where the lower maximums, as specified, shall apply:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 35$ and costs. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of $\$ 2$ per mile for each mile in excess of five miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.
§ 15-205. Traffic Signals at Certain Locations. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. At the following locations traffic signals as indicated below shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected), and traffic at those locations shall be directed by those signals:

2. Any driver of a vehicle who disobeys the directions of any traffic signal shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 25$ and costs.
§ 15-206. Intersections Where Turn Prohibited on Red Signal. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. The following are established as intersections where drivers of vehicles headed in the direction or directions indicated are prohibited from making a right turn (or a left turn from a one-way street into another one-way street) on a steady red signal:

2. Any driver of a vehicle who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 25$ and costs.
§ 15-207. One-Way Roadways Established. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. The following are established as one-way roadways, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any one-way street other than in the direction established for traffic on that street:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 25$ and costs.
§ 15-208. Turning at Certain Intersections Prohibited or Restricted. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle of the type indicated traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to make a left turn and/or a right turn into the second-named street, as indicated, at any time when such a turn is prohibited by this Section:

§ 15-406. Special Purpose Parking Zones Established; Parking Otherwise Prohibited. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

The following are established as special purpose parking zones, and it shall be unlawful for any
person to park a vehicle or to allow it to remain parked in any such zone except as specifically provided for that zone:

§ 15-407. Standing or Parking on Roadway for Loading or Unloading. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

It shall be unlawful for any person to stop, stand or park a vehicle (other than a pedalcycle) on the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of any street, except that standing or parking for the purpose of loading or unloading persons or property shall be permitted on the following named streets on Monday through Saturday, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. and between the hours of 1:30 p.m. and 4:00 p.m., and for no longer than necessary for the loading or unloading.

§ 15-408. Angle Parking Required on Portions of Certain Streets. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. Only angle parking shall be permitted on the following portions of streets:

2. On all streets where angle parking is required, every vehicle parked at the angle shall be parked with its front nearest the curb.
§ 15-409. Parking Prohibited on Portions of Certain Highways During Street Sweeping Hours. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle or to allow the same to remain parked, at any time between $\qquad$ ] and $\qquad$ ] on any of the following portions of the highways of the Township on the days hereby respectively designated for street sweeping purposes:

§ 15-410. Handicapped Parking. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. Definitions. As used in this Part, the following terms shall have the meaning indicated, unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context:

MOTOR VEHICLE - Any type of mechanical device, propelled by a motor in which persons
or property may be transported upon public streets or highways and including trailers or semitrailers pulled thereby.

PERSON - A natural person, firm, partnership, association, corporation or other legal entity.
In this Part, the singular shall include the plural; the plural shall include the singular; and the masculine shall include the feminine and the neuter.
2. Establishment of Handicapped Parking Areas. It is hereby established that there shall be from the effective date of this Part handicapped parking areas described as follows:

3. Regulation of Parking. There shall be no parking of a motor vehicle in the handicapped areas established by this Part except for persons parking motor vehicles lawfully bearing a handicapped or severely disabled veteran registration plate or displaying a handicapped or severely disabled veteran parking placard when such motor vehicles are being operated by or for the transportation of a handicapped person or a severely disabled veteran and this restriction shall apply during all hours of the day.
4. Impoundment, Ticketing and Penalties. The removal and impoundment of illegally parked motor vehicles, the ticketing of illegally parked motor vehicles and the penalties for violations of this Part shall be set forth in the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

## § 15-411. Penalties. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

Any person who violates any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than $\$ 15$ and costs. Provided, it shall be the duty of the police officers and of parking enforcement personnel of the Township to report to the appropriate official all violations of any provision of this Part indicating, in each case, the Section violated; the license number of the vehicle involved in the violation; the location where the violation took place; and any other facts that might be necessary in order to secure a clear understanding of the circumstances attending the violation. The police officer or other person making the report shall also attach to or place upon every such vehicle a notice stating that the vehicle was parked in violation of this Part. The notice shall contain instructions to the owner or driver of the vehicle that if he will report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay the sum of \$ $\qquad$ within $\qquad$ hours after the time of the notice, or if he will place the sum of $\$$ $\qquad$ enclosed within the envelope provided in any of the special parking fine boxes installed at various locations within the Township, that act will save the violator from prosecution and from payment of the fine and costs prescribed in the first sentence of this Section.

## Part 5 <br> REMOVAL AND IMPOUNDMENT OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES

§ 15-501. Applicability and Scope. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
This Part is enacted under authority of $\S 6109(\mathrm{a})(22)$ of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 6109(a)(22) and gives authority to the Township to remove and impound those vehicles which are parked in a tow-away zone and in violation of parking regulations of this Chapter. Vehicles which have been abandoned (as defined by the Vehicle Code) or which are parked in such a manner as to interfere with traffic or pose a hazard to others may be towed under the provisions of the Vehicle Code.
§ 15-502. Authority to Remove and Impound. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
The Township shall have authority to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impounding, of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally; provided, that the circumstances of its parking were within the conditions stated in § 15-801. Provided, no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Part or the provisions of the Vehicle Code.
§ 15-503. Tow Away Zones Designated. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
The following designated streets and/or parking lots are hereby established as tow-away zones. Signs shall be posted to place the public on notice that their vehicles may be towed for violation of Township parking regulations:

(Reserved)
§ 15-504. Designation of Approved Storage Garages; Bonding; Towing and Storage. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

Removal and impounding of vehicles under this Part shall be done only by "approved storage garages" that shall be designated from time to time by the Board of Supervisors. Every such garage shall submit evidence to the Board of Supervisors that it is bonded or has acquired liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to the Board of Supervisors as sufficient to indemnify owners of impounded vehicles against loss or damage to those vehicles while in the custody of the garage keeper for the purpose of towing or storage. The approved storage garage shall submit to the Board of Supervisors its schedule of charges for towing and storage of vehicles under this Part and, when the schedule is approved by the Board of Supervisors, those charges shall be adhered to by the approved storage garage; no different schedule of charges shall be demanded of or collected from any person whose vehicle is removed or impounded under this Part by any approved storage garage. The Board of Supervisors shall delete from its list of approved storage garages any garage that makes any unapproved charge in connection with any vehicle removed or impounded under this Part.
§ 15-505. Payment of Towing and Storage Charges. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

The payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this Part for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.
§ 15-506. Reclamation Costs. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
In order to reclaim his vehicle, the owner shall pay towing and storage costs plus a $\$ 25$ fee, of which $\$ 10$ shall be transferred to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation by the garage to which the vehicle was taken.
§ 15-507. Records of Vehicles Removed and Impounded. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
The Township shall cause a record to be kept of all vehicles impounded under this Part and shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or the agents of the owners of those vehicles with information as to the place of storage of the vehicle.
§ 15-508. Restrictions Upon Removal of Vehicles. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this Part or the Vehicle Code if, at the time of the intended removal, the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately.
§ 15-509. Penalty for Violation. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 50$ together with all costs of disposing of the vehicle under the provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 P.S. § 7301 et seq.
§ 15-510. Reports and Disposition of Unclaimed Vehicles. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
If after a period of 15 days the vehicle in storage remains unclaimed, a report shall be filed with PennDOT in accordance with $\S 7311$ of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 7311, by the person having legal custody of the vehicle. If the vehicle has not been claimed after 30 days, the vehicle may be transferred to a licensed salvor who will then be responsible for filing the proper reports and disposing of the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 73 of the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa C.S.A. § 7301 et seq.

## Part 6 <br> SNOW AND ICE EMERGENCY

§ 15-601. Declaration of Snow and Ice Emergency. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named in § 15-903, the [Designated Official], in his discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency (designated in this Part as a "snow emergency"). Information on the existence of a snow emergency shall be given by the Township through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.
§ 15-602. Parking Prohibited, Driving Motor Vehicles Restricted on Snow Emergency Routes During Emergency. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. After any snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the emergency for any person:
A. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated in § 15-603.
B. To drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains.
§ 15-603. Snow Emergency Routes Designated. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
The following are designated as snow emergency routes:

(Reserved)
§ 15-604. Penalty for Violation. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]
2. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under § 15-601, a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain parked anywhere upon a snow emergency route, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Part and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than $\$ 15$ and costs.
3. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under § 15-601, a person shall drive a motor vehicle upon a snow emergency route without having that vehicle equipped with snow tires or chains, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Part and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 25$ and costs.

## Part 7

## REGULATION OF PEDALCYCLES AND NONMOTORIZED VEHICLES

§ 15-701. Riding and Parking of Pedalcycles on Sidewalks Along Certain Streets Prohibited. [Ord. No. 2005-7, 12/19/2005]

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or to park a pedalcycle on the sidewalk along the following portions of the streets in the Township:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of $\$ 5$ and costs.

Part 8
VEHICLE NUISANCES
§ 15-801. Title. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]

This Part shall be known as the "Sandy Township Motor Vehicle Nuisance Ordinance."
§ 15-802. Purpose. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
The Board of Supervisors recognizes and finds that the accumulation of junked vehicles creates a hazard or threat or potential threat to the health, safety or welfare of the Township's citizens because such accumulation provides a breeding area for rodents and vermin and because such accumulation provides an attractive nuisance for children who are not aware of the dangers involved.
§ 15-803. Definitions. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
For purposes of this Part, the following definitions shall be applicable:
JUNKED MOTOR VEHICLE - A motor vehicle or trailer which is partially dismantled, unused, unusable or wrecked and which cannot safely or legally be operated on the streets or highways of this Township or Commonwealth. Motor vehicles that have an expired license, registration, or inspection shall be included within this definition.

MOTOR VEHICLE - Any type of mechanical device propelled by a motor in which persons or property may be transported, including but not limited to automobiles, water crafts, trucks, buses, motor homes, motorized campers, motorcycles, motor scooters, dirt bikes, tractors, snowmobiles, dune buggies, ATVs, UTVs, other off-road vehicles, and trailers or semi-trailers pulled thereby.

MOTOR VEHICLE ACCESSORIES - Any part or parts of any motor vehicle.
PERSON - Any natural person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, or other legal entity of whatever kind.

PRIVATE PROPERTY - Any real property not owned by the federal government, state, county, school district or other political subdivisions.

PUBLIC NUISANCE - The unsheltered storage of a junked motor vehicle as otherwise defined in this Part which constitutes a hazard or threat or potential threat to the health, safety, or welfare of the Township's citizens.

REMOVAL - The physical location or relocation of a motor vehicle to an authorized location.
TRAILER - Any wheeled device used as a means of carrying, hauling or conveying any vehicle, person, animal, boat or other object.

UNSHELTERED STORAGE - Any storage except storage inside a building or in an area completely surrounded by an opaque fence of a height not less than six feet.
§ 15-804. Prohibited Storage. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
It shall be unlawful for any person owning or having custody of any junked motor vehicle or motor vehicle accessories which creates a hazard or threat or potential threat to the health, safety or welfare of the Township's citizens to store or permit any such vehicle or accessories to remain in unsheltered storage on any private property or public street or highway within the Township for a period of more than 30 days after the expiration of the thirty-day period following receipt of
a notice requiring such removal, and it shall be further unlawful for any person owning any private property in the Township or leasing any such property to store or to permit to remain any such vehicles or accessories on their property for more than a like period. It shall further be unlawful for any person, after notification to remove any junked motor vehicle or motor vehicle accessories constituting a public nuisance hereunder from any private property has been given, to move the same to any other private property upon which such storage is not permitted or onto any public highway or other public property for purposes of storage.
§ 15-805. Permitted storage. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
The prohibitions of § 15-804 hereof shall not apply to a junked motor vehicle or motor vehicle accessories stored within an enclosed building or in an area completely surrounded by an opaque fence of a height not less than six feet, and the prohibitions of § 15-804 hereof shall not apply to the premises of a business enterprise otherwise operated in a lawful place and manner when necessary to the operation of such business enterprise, in a storage place or depository maintained in a lawful place and manner, or seasonal use vehicles such as snowmobiles, motorcycles, motor scooters and nonmotorized campers. Such business enterprises shall include auto repair and auto body shops, but shall not include tire, battery and accessory sales stores, and the provisions hereof extending to permitted storage shall not extend to the storage at such business enterprises of more than five junked vehicles or trailers at any one time.
§ 15-806. Investigation of premises. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
The Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Officer, on routine inspection or upon receipt of a complaint, may enter upon private property to investigate a suspected junked motor vehicle or motor vehicle accessories stored or maintained in violation of this Part and record the make, model, style and identification numbers and its situation and condition.
§ 15-807. Notice of removal. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
Whenever the Building Inspector, Code Enforcement Officer or any member of their department finds or is notified that any junked motor vehicle or motor vehicle accessories have been stored or permitted to remain on any private property or public street or highway within the Township and in violation of the provisions of this Part, the Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Officer shall send by certified or registered mail a notice to the owner of record or person having custody of such motor vehicle or accessories, if such owner can be ascertained by the exercise of reasonable diligence, and also to the owner of the private property, as shown on the tax assessment records of the Township, on which the same is located, to remove the junked motor vehicle, trailer or motor vehicle accessories within 30 days. Such notice shall contain the following additional information:

1. Nature of complaint;
2. Description and location of the motor vehicle and/or motor vehicle accessories;
3. Statement that the motor vehicle or motor vehicle accessories shall be removed from the premises no later than 30 days from the date of notification;
4. Statement that removal from the location specified in the notification to another location
upon which such storage is not permitted is prohibited and shall subject the person to additional penalties;
5. Statement that if removal is made within the time limits specified, notification thereof shall be given in writing to the Building Inspector or Code Enforcement Officer; and
6. Statement of the penalties provided for noncompliance with such notice.
§ 15-808. Penalties. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Part shall be subject to a penalty in a summary proceeding or civil collection proceeding in an amount not exceeding $\$ 1,000$ for each violation. Every day that a violation continues after notice thereof has been provided to the violator shall be considered a separate violation. In addition, the Township may institute injunctive, mandamus, or any other appropriate action or proceeding at law or in equity for the enforcement of the provisions of this ordinance. Any court of competent jurisdiction shall have the right to issue restraining orders, temporary or permanent injunctions, mandamus or other appropriate forms of remedy or relief.
§ 15-809. Repealer. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. The following ordinance is specifically repealed: Sandy Township Ordinance No. 1993-5.
§ 15-810. Severability. [Ord. No. 2020-1, 1/6/2020]
The sections and subsections of this Part shall be deemed to be severable. A determination that any section or subsection of this Part is unenforceable shall not affect the enforceability of any other section or subsection.
